TO: EMTs

SUBJECT: Advanced airway management

NAS EMTs are authorised to use the laryngeal tube as an advanced airway, once the have received the appropriate training.

RATIONALE:

The CPG "Advanced Airway Management – Adult" 4.3.1 (2014 CPG Edition) authorises EMTs to utilise a supraglottic airway but restricts this to a non-inflatable supraglottic airway. NAS is standardising the Laryngeal Tube as the supraglottic airway for use across all clinical levels – this Clinical Directive authorises EMTs to use the Laryngeal Tube, which is an inflatable supraglottic airway.
