Subject: PATIENT NON - TRANSPORT

Dear colleagues,

I am writing to remind you of your obligations in circumstances where patients are not transported to hospital, which are outlined in the accompanying NAS Guidance Document on Patient Non – Transport.

In particular, I want to reiterate that with the exception of:

- a) possible COVID 19 patients who are clinically appropriate for home treatment (as per NASCG 022020 Ambulance Operations Procedure Non-Conveyance of Suspected or Confirmed Adult COVID 19 Patients);
- b) patients treated by Community Paramedics or NAS staff on NAS approved non conveyance programmes,

there is no provision for NAS staff to assess and discharge a patient on scene.

- 1. Accordingly, I am re-issuing an updated version of the NAS Guidance Document on Patient Non Transport (previously titled "NAS Guidance Document on Patient Refusal of Transport"). Please ensure that you are familiar with this document and adhere to its provisions.
- 2. In parallel, in cases of patient refusal of transport, all practitioners are <u>required</u> to submit a printed copy of the patient ePCR to their station supervisor for audit.
